

## Placer SPCA Services & Programs

### ■ **Adoptions**

At the Placer SPCA it is our goal to place each animal in a loving, permanent home. Our staff and volunteers work hard to ensure a lifelong match is made through adoption counseling and socialization. In addition to our on-site adoptions, we also have our PetMobile, that takes our adoptable animals off-site and into the community, in hope of finding them their forever home.

### ■ **Spay & Neuter Assistance Program**

Our Spay/Neuter Assistance Program (SNAP) provides financial aid and advice to Placer County pet owners who need financial incentive to alter their animals. The program is funded by the generosity of donors and through foundations and other grant makers that share our goal of bringing an end to pet overpopulation.

### ■ **Foster Parenting Program**

The Placer SPCA's foster parenting program affords those animals in need – kittens too small that need extra care or are too young and unable to be altered, dogs recovering from surgery or other special medical treatment, critters in need of some TLC and socialization – a temporary home so they can receive some special love and care before they are put up for adoption.



### ■ **Guardian Angel Program**

Our Guardian Angel program was established to help special needs animals receive the care and attention they need before being placed into their permanent loving home. The program helps treat conditions such as heartworm, bordetella and various infections, as well as help us cover veterinary expenses for treatment of injuries such as broken legs, diagnostic tests and other non-routine procedures. In addition, the Guardian Angel program can help pay for procedures such as dental work and grooming, which increase an animal's chance of finding a new home.

### ■ **Behavior & Training**

Many animals find their way into shelters because of behavioral issues or concerns that have become overwhelming for their owners to handle. In many cases, had the animals been exposed to some form of behavior and obedience training, their situations would have been far more manageable. Our Behavior Department strives to understand an animal's behavior and then takes the necessary steps to modify unsatisfactory behavior. By doing this, we can help to promote a happy, healthy human-animal relationship for the animals in our care, as well as serve as a resource to local pet owners.

### ■ **Lost & Found**

As part of our mission, the Placer SPCA helps to reunite lost pets with their owners. Whether you have found a pet or are in the unfortunate circumstance of having lost your companion animal friend, the Placer SPCA is here to help!
